One of Our Most Powerful Tools: Education

Students at Eastern High School are Learning About the POWER of Wind, Thanks to Donors Like You.

While studying electricity production and alternate energy sources, EHS students now have the opportunity to experiment with wind turbine designs. Jennifer Olesh, Earth Science teacher, applied for a teacher grant to purchase the supplies and received \$200.00, which covered the cost to purchase everything she needed in order to introduce this new unit to her students.

As part of the lesson, students experiment with the design of the blades to see what factors affect the production of electricity. The purpose of the unit is to learn about alternative energy sources and to practice manipulating variables to reach an outcome. "I came up with the idea last summer when I attended a STEM conference for teachers," explained Jennifer. "When I saw what they were doing I knew it would be a great addition to the earth science classes, if I could get the supplies."

By experimenting with variables such as blade pitch and

length, students are able to see which design allows the highest production of electricity. Students then present their findings to the class. Students will also use the turbine to experiment with practical uses of electricity, like

pumping water or running a light. "It was amazing to learn how wind can create electricity," stated Hayden England. "I never thought that we would get the chance to build model wind turbines."

Wind is an important resource for the production of electricity. It is low cost, clean and has seen an increase in use over the past several years. Seven large-scale wind farms in Northern Indiana provide electricity for Indiana and surrounding states. "I enjoyed learning about the engineering aspects of wind turbines," Ian Dillon said.

Thanks to generous donors like you, teachers in Washington County are able to teach real world projects that may not be covered in a normal school budget.

Because of donors like you, the Washington County Community Foundation was able to start our adult education program, Education Matters, in 2012. Karen Barry was one of the first adults to receive a scholarship. “I came across an article in the Salem Leader about the Adult Education Scholarship. After reading the article and the criteria which sounded exactly like my circumstances, I called the community foundation to see just how to apply,” explained Karen. “I was looking for any financial assistance possible. The receipt of this scholarship enabled me to increase the number of classes I was able to take. I could finally see the possibility of achieving my life-long dream of earning my degree as a reality.”

Karen graduated. “I am proud to say I earned my Bachelors of General Studies from Ball State University on December 17, 2015. After nearly 30 years (I graduated from high school in 1987), I’d finally achieved a life-long dream; earning a college degree, making me the first in my family to be a college graduate.

On August 16, 2016 I began my new career as Graduation and Careers Coach through Ivy Tech, Bloomington. I will be working from Salem High School. I get the privilege and honor of working with students who are in much the same

circumstances I was as a student in high school. What a blessing I have been given. Your generosity helped make all of this possible. Whereas thank you just doesn’t seem to be enough, I would like to express my sincere thank you to the committee and the donors to the Community Foundation for believing in me and helping me fulfill this dream. I am blessed, proud and so thankful to be part of such a wonderful community

that not only supports and encourages its members, but also goes that extra mile to help them achieve their dreams.”

Approximately 18% of our adult population has some college but no degree. Less than 20% of our adults have a college degree. If we can help those with some college go back and complete, then we can almost double the number of adults with a college degree or certification, which will give us a tremendous economic development advantage.

Currently, we have twelve adults in our Education Matters program. Our goal is to help adults with some college but no

degree go back to school to obtain a degree or certification. We offer mentors, financial counselling, and career counselling.
