Just about everyone who visited The Wall That Heals will tell you the same thing: “It was so much more than I expected.” “See it twice. But if you can only see it once, see it at night.”



It truly was a once in a lifetime event for Washington County. Many of our residents will never travel to Washington DC to see the actual Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall, so bringing this $\frac{3}{4}$ scaled replica here was something we wanted to do to celebrate our local Veterans. Especially those who served during the Vietnam era, because they never did get a “Welcome Home” while they were serving. The Wall truly helps people heal.

Thanks to you, we have made it to our 25th Anniversary. We are celebrating Superheroes all over the county..... Superheroes like you, who are working hard to make Washington County a better place to live, work and raise a family.

In April we celebrated our local firefighters and law enforcement personnel with a reception that had over 145 people in attendance. Because of generous donors like you, we were able to give each department that attended a \$1,000.00 grant. The three departments that had the most attendees also took home an extra \$1,000.00. In all, \$17,000.00 in grants were awarded that evening. Here are some of the thank yous from that event:
